Senior Emergency Coordinator

- Advanced degree in appropriate technical field (Public Health, Medicine, Sociology, Demography, Gender, International Relations/ Development, Economics, Public Administration, Management).
- 10-15 years of increasingly responsible experience in coordinating, developing and implementing humanitarian interventions in crisis settings.
- Knowledge of the humanitarian reform process including roles and responsibilities of humanitarian actors and humanitarian standards.
- Experience with implementing the Minimum Initial Service Package and experience in Reproductive Health (RH) implementation of Emergency Kits is desirable
- Strong analytical, coordination and organizational skills.
- Fluency in English. Depending on the duty station, another UN language (insert appropriate language) such as French, Spanish, Arabic, Chinese or Russian may be required.

Communications Officer

- Advanced degree in communications, public relations, journalism, advertising or related field.
- 3-7 years of experience in communications, public relations, journalism or advertising; preferably some experience with public relations or information campaigns.
- Experience in or familiarity with a humanitarian setting a major asset.
- Fluency in English. Depending on the duty station, another UN language such as French, Spanish, Arabic, Chinese or Russian may be required.

Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) Specialist

- Advanced university degree in Midwifery, Medicine, Nursing, Public Health, or relevant Social Sciences.
- 5 to 10 years of relevant experience in SRH program development and management, preferably in an emergency context, particularly implementing the MISP.
- Field experience in complex emergencies, including humanitarian emergency response.
- Demonstrated leadership and management experience within a multinational and multicultural environment.
- Ability to develop and coordinate SRH programs that target refugees, IDPs/returnees and their host communities.
- Proficiency in English and in other official languages or the UN required/desirable (insert specific CO language needs where necessary).

Gender Based Violence in Emergencies

GBV Programme Manager

- Advanced technical degree with specialization in areas such as social work, public health, gender, law/human rights, international relations, and/or other related social science disciplines.
- 2 to 10 years of specialized experience addressing GBV at the international level; experience in this field in a humanitarian context an asset.
- Demonstrated leadership and management experience within a multinational and multicultural environment.
- Direct experience providing support to GBV survivors an asset.
- Proficiency in English and in other official languages or the UN required/desirable

GBV Information Management Officer

- Advanced technical degree in social sciences, (e.g. in public health, humanitarian affairs, political science, development studies, demography or a related field) or the equivalent combination of education and experience in a related area.
- Professional experience in IM for the humanitarian sector, including secondary data reviews, 3/4/5W reporting, gap analysis, etc.
- Familiarity with Excel, desktop publishing software, and basic website management.
- Professional experience with GBV or any other aspect of protection in emergencies, including demonstrated understanding of monitoring and evaluation (M&E).
- Demonstrated understanding of the survivor-centered approach to GBV programming, particularly in the context of information management (i.e. GBVIMS training).
- Knowledge of the Cluster Approach and the Transformative Agenda systems and procedures.
- Knowledge of the humanitarian architecture.
- Ability to synthesize large amounts of information into concise, effective resources for decision-making and advocacy purposes.
- Strong interest and motivation for inter-agency coordination.
- Flexibility, diplomacy, leadership, cultural sensitivity and the ability to work well both alone and in teams.
